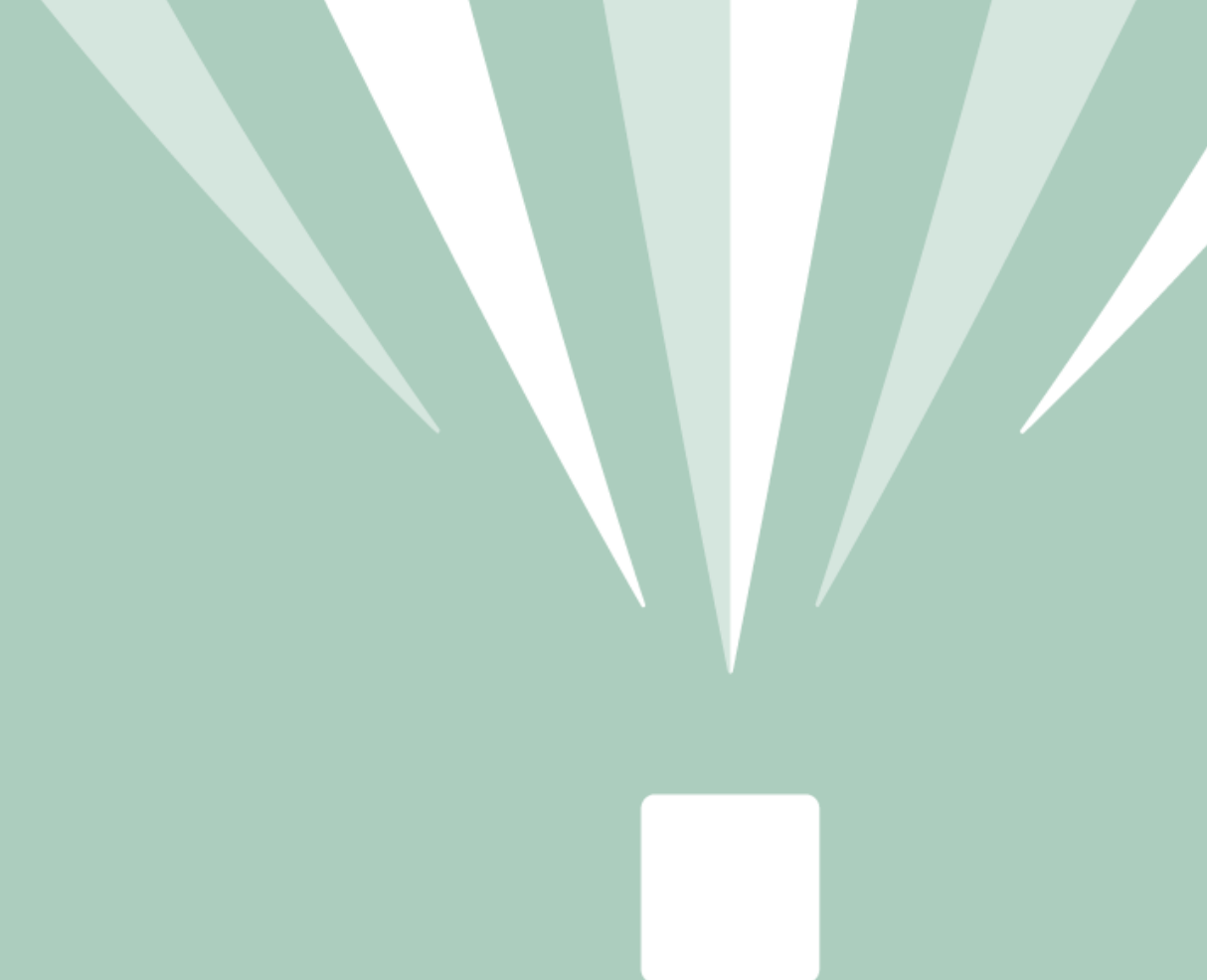

Introducing Our Village

Our Village is an exciting new chapter in the story of three of Victoria's most loved charities: St Kilda Mums, Geelong Mums and Eureka Mums.

Together as Our Village, we will increase our impact for vulnerable babies, children and the environment.

Our Village helps more than 20,000 babies and children every year across Victoria.

We believe in the potential of children to grow healthy and strong if they have the care they need. We believe in the potential of used goods to have a purposeful second life. Most of all, we believe in the potential of our community when we come together to help.

It takes a village to raise a child and save the planet. This is the power of Our Village.

This year's reporting approach

Our Village has changed its financial year end from 30 June to 31 December to better align with the fundraising cycle. In making this change, this Annual Report will cover a one-off 18-month period from 1 July 2023–31 December 2024.

CEO's message

I am proud to present the Annual Report for Our Village 2024.

This Annual Report covers an 18-month period while we transition from a financial year end in June to a financial year end in December. Even with this extra long reporting window, the enormity of what we have achieved – thanks to our community's generous donations of pre-loved goods, time and money – is incredible.

Powered by **more than 60,000 hours of volunteer work**, we have **supported 33,384 babies and children**. In doing so, a massive **398,177kgs of valuable, high quality pre-loved goods have been diverted from landfill**. That's truly amazing! Thank you to everyone who made this possible.

These achievements have been delivered in a challenging context. More than 800,000 Victorians live in poverty, including 216,000 children (VCOSS, August 2023). That's more than one in eight people, and they are in every town and every suburb of Victoria. You may not realise it, because people hide it well, but within every neighbourhood there will be people struggling to make ends meet. Shockingly, the age group with the highest rate of poverty in Victoria is children. Never has our service been more vital than it is today. THIS is why Our Village exists.

Like many Australian charities, however, the cost-of-living crisis is impacting our fundraising revenue. And so, as we continue to ask you for financial donations that are critical to our future, we have also tightened our own belt. One of the ways we did this was by rebranding.

We had been living and breathing the sentiment *"it takes a village to raise a child"* for years, and in May 2024, we officially rebranded as Our Village, bringing St Kilda Mums, Geelong Mums and Eureka Mums together. By removing the need to produce everything three times, under three different names, we have reduced costs, which in turn enables us to put more resources on the frontline and increase our impact. My sincere thanks to our partner, L'Oréal Groupe for funding most of this project and, along with the DECJUBA Foundation, becoming Our Village's Founding Corporate Partners – we're so grateful for your support.

Even though fundraising has become harder, and even though we know it's getting tough for people to give, we will continue to ask – because we know Victoria's kids need our help. And every \$1 donated in the last 18 months enabled us to provide \$2.76 of essential items for babies and children – so we can guarantee that your dollars work hard for kids across Victoria when you donate to Our Village.

Feedback we get from parents and carers tells us that the gift of a cot, a car seat, a pram, some clothes, toys or books from Our Village not only provides the practical support their child needs, it also supports the child's carer. They feel that they matter, that their life has value, too. It gives them that boost of self-esteem to tackle life's challenges head on. To know that others in the community care enough to provide these essentials for their children makes an intangible world of difference. This is what will start to lift Victoria out of our current economic and social challenges.

A massive thank you to all our supporters, donors and volunteers for being a critical part of Our Village. We simply couldn't achieve so much without every single one of you, and I'm excited about what we can continue to achieve together.

Chair's message

After seven years of incredible service to the charity, Deidre MacKechne stood down as Chair in October 2024.

Under Deidre's guidance, the charity transformed from three small, local operations to one statewide charity. We moved to our Clayton warehouse and expanded our service right across regional Victoria. Special thanks must also go to the Anthony Costa Foundation for their significant funding of this work over this reporting period. Deidre also steered our organisation through the immense challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic and oversaw the transition of our governance and leadership from being founder-led to the recruitment of our first independent CEO. We simply can't thank Deidre enough for the time and care she has given to our cause, staff and volunteers.

We know Our Village is increasingly part of the fabric of Victoria's support system for families right across the state. The cost-of-living and housing crises are hurting hundreds of thousands of Victorian families. But at the same time, there is incredible wealth and waste within our community.

Our ambition to share more and waste less so every child thrives tackles both of these issues head on. By turning pre-loved items into re-loved care packages, we divert used goods from landfill and help vulnerable children. Our goal is to expand our operation to support every Victorian child that needs us. Please let us know if you can help us move towards this huge ambition.

It takes a village to raise a child. And for those people who don't have a village around them, we are ready to step in. I am proud of the energy and positivity with which Our Village is providing essentials for Victoria's most vulnerable children at a time when more and more of us are facing the challenges of economic downturn. To everyone who has continued to donate to us, thank you.

I have been delighted to see new partners like Baby Bunting, the DTMF Group and Cadillac join us this year, as well as a number of foundations who stepped up to help, like the Bibury Trust, the Helen and David Hains Foundation and the Brian M Davies Foundation in particular. The City of Greater Geelong has also been an instrumental partner over this period – thank you all. A full list of supporters is available in this report and we're grateful to each and every one – as well as those who prefer to keep their donation anonymous.

Supporting babies and children








Our lives are impacted by our experiences in early childhood. The attachment between a child and their primary carer in the first 2,000 days of life influences that child’s health, development and resilience. If there is economic, psychological and/or physical distress, the ability to develop this bond is at risk.

We alleviate these pressures and create the opportunity for every child to feel secure, safe and to thrive.

We work with social workers, healthcare professionals and community workers who assess the needs of vulnerable babies and children, placing orders with Our Village for the essential items these children need and would otherwise go without.

From July 2023-December 2024, Our Village supported 33,384 children and babies across Victoria. We rehomed 114,009 pre-loved items, with a second-hand value of \$12.7 million.

Babies and children supported by Our Village received:

-  **21,421** clothing bundles
-  **14,694** toy and book bags
-  **6,540** linen bundles
-  **2,325** prams
-  **2,192** car restraints
-  **968** high chairs
-  **818** cots

The leading causes of vulnerability leading to requests for support were:

1. Unemployment / underemployed
2. Single parent
3. Family violence
4. Migrant / refugee / asylum seeker
5. Homeless / risk of homelessness

Our impact

Reducing waste

The world has finite resources. The way we buy, use and dispose of goods has a negative impact on our planet. We're investing our energy into changing the way we consume goods. As part of the circular economy, we are reducing waste and pollution by extending the life cycle of kids' essential goods through repair and reuse.

We rehome pre-loved items to support children in need today, while also creating a better environment for them to enjoy in the future.

From July 2023-December 2024,
Our Village:



Received 384,329 kg of donations*



Delivered 325,086 kg of pre-loved items to new homes



Recycled 73,091 kg of items that were not suitable for rehoming



Which means that an enormous 398,177 kg was diverted from landfill.*

*Geelong began capturing weight data in September 2023, so this figure does not include items donated through the Geelong warehouse in July and August 2023.

Fighting waste with Melbourne Cleaning Cloths

Our Village prides itself on delivering pre-loved items to babies, children, parents and carers that are in excellent condition. But sometimes, the items that are generously donated by our supporters aren't able to be rehomed — they may be damaged, stained or in poor condition. The absolute last resort is sending items to landfill, so we work with a network of partners to reuse and recycle as much as possible.

For more than 10 years, Melbourne Cleaning Cloths has supported Our Village by collecting clothing that we can't rehome. These items are turned into bundles of rags that are sold here in Australia.

Tom Ward is the Managing Director of Melbourne Cleaning Cloths, and is proud to work with Our Village.

"We're happy to help out, to take the stuff that [Our Village] can't use."

Melbourne Cleaning Cloths also donated industrial scales to help Our Village weigh our goods, and has loaned a 20-foot shipping container for extra storage.

We are grateful to work in partnership with organisations like Melbourne Cleaning Cloths, who are committed to finding a use for material items and keeping them out of landfill.

Volunteer experiences

Our Village was started by volunteers – small groups of mums in St Kilda, Geelong and Ballarat – who collected pre-loved items in their own homes. Today, we are a community that is more than just mums and we support families right across Victoria. But we are still driven by the hard work and care of people who donate their time and skills to us – thousands of volunteers now operate across our two warehouses.

The way we provide our service, with the help of incredible volunteers, provides opportunities for people to give back, be part of a community of care and impact, develop skills, build friendships and use their talents for good.

The organisation changed its financial year end from 30 June to 31 December to better align with the fundraising cycle. In making this change, the current financial period is a one-off 18 month period.
